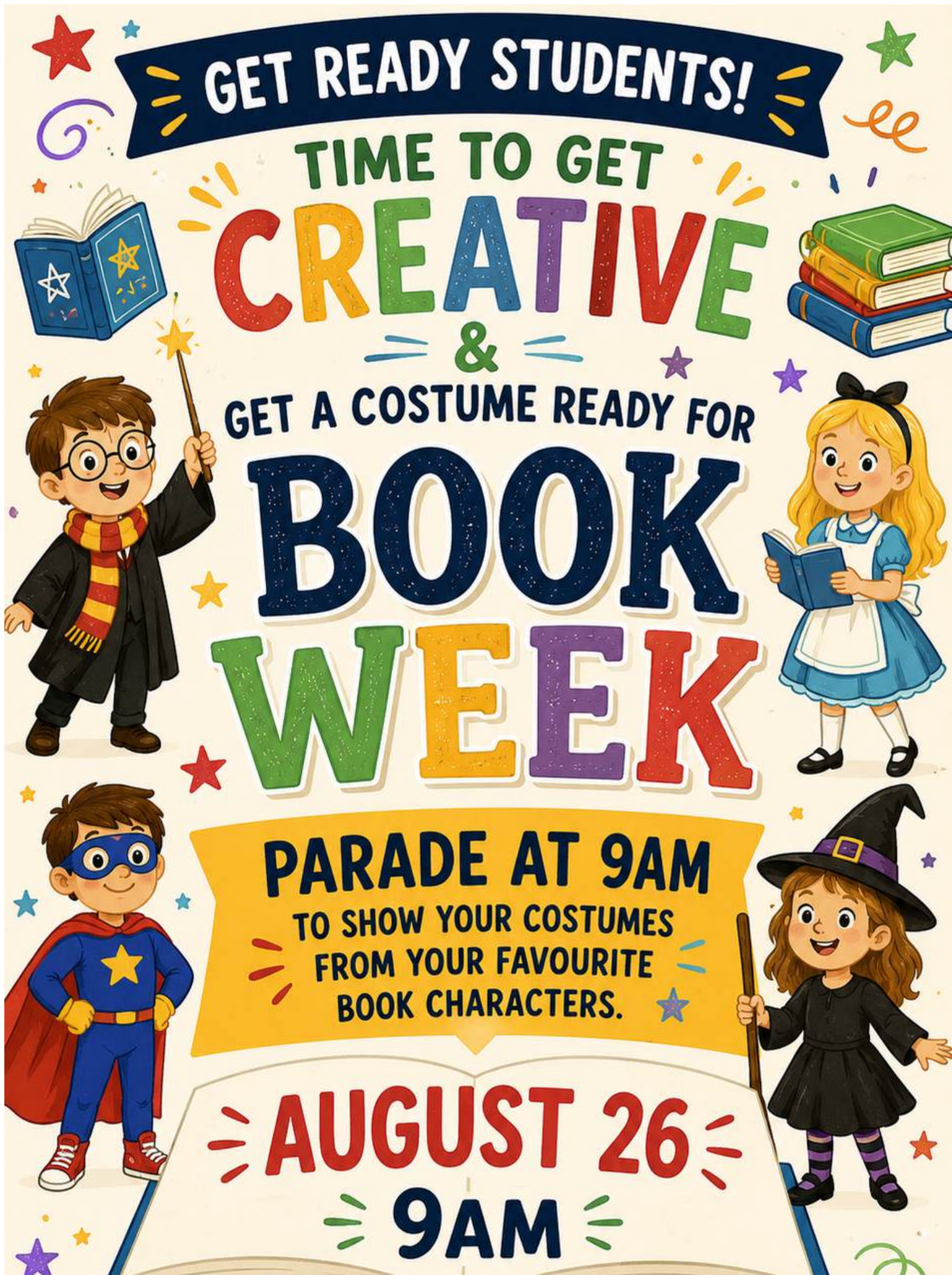

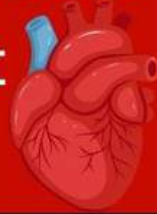


Together we raised
