- Your child's birth certificate or identity documents.
- Proof of your child's residential address.

- If your child was born outside Australia or is a temporary resident of Australia, you need their passport, visa and travel documents.
- You need to tell the school whether your child has an Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) immunisation history statement.

Our school recently came together to support **Do It For Dolly Day**, an important reminder to always choose kindness and stand up against bullying.

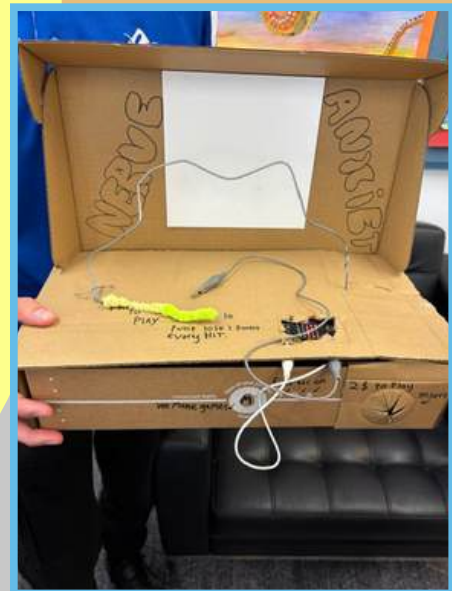
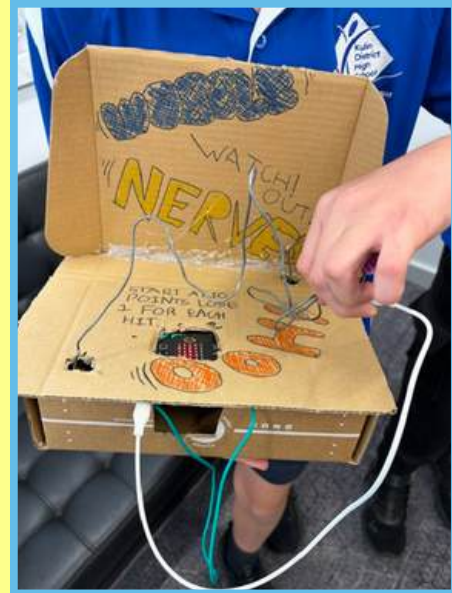

The current year 7/8 Digital Technologies group is discovering how to use a Micro:bit (a small microcontroller) to enhance devices and games they have created.

We design then build our ideas (using recycled materials). Then there is computer coding done to make the Micro:bit respond to what is happening to our device. These games cause the Micro:bit to keep a score of how many times the wire 'wand' touches the curvy wire as you try to get from start to finish.

We are currently learning to control other pieces of hardware (eg: motors and servos).

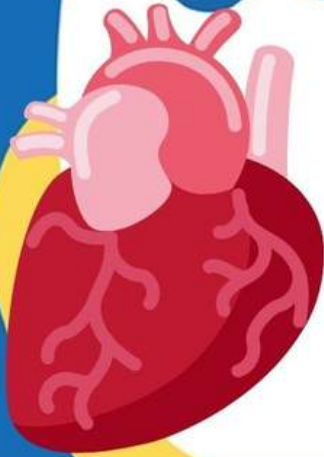

Jump Rope for Heart is underway at KULIN D.H.S!

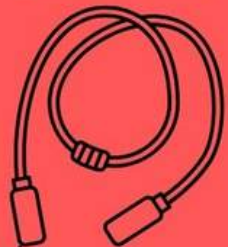
A fantastic fundraising and physical activity program by the Heart Foundation.

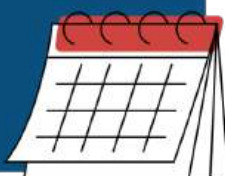
