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Reports

Teachers have been busy finalising Semester One reports, which will be emailed to parents on Monday, 29 June. We encourage families to take the time to review their child's progress and celebrate their achievements from the first half of the year.

You may notice some changes to the report format this semester. These changes are part of a consistent approach to semester reporting for students from Pre-primary to Year 10, introduced by the Department.

For students in Pre-primary to Year 6, reports will now include mode and strand reporting for English and Mathematics only. For students in Years 7 to 10, mode, strand and sub-strand reporting will no longer be included. For example, students will receive an overall grade for HASS rather than separate grades for individual areas such as History, Geography, Economics and Civics and Citizenship. These changes aim to provide a more consistent reporting framework across all schools while continuing to communicate student achievement and progress effectively.

As always, if you have any questions regarding your child's report, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

Compass

Commencing next term, we will be moving towards using Compass as our primary platform for all school communication. Next week, you will receive an email as part of the parent onboarding process. Please follow the instructions carefully to ensure you are set up and ready for this transition.

We will gradually move away from Audiri once we are confident that all parents have access to Compass and are able to use it effectively. This change is part of a department initiative and will be implemented across all government schools.

We appreciate your support as we make this transition, which will help streamline communication between home and school.

Once again, there are so many wonderful things happening across our school, many of which are featured throughout this newsletter. Wishing everyone a restful and enjoyable mid-term break. We look forward to welcoming students back to school on Monday 20th July.
