

Celebrating Outstanding Achievements in Athletics



TERM 3, WEEK 3

On 29 July, a magnitude 8.8 earthquake struck off the coast of Russia's Kamchatka Peninsula at a depth of ~20 km. This event now ranks among the top 10 strongest earthquakes ever recorded globally, and is the second-largest in this region after the 1952 magnitude 9.0 event.

Kamchatka lies along the Kuril-Kamchatka subduction zone, where the Pacific Plate is diving beneath the Okhotsk Plate at around 75 mm/year — making it one of the most seismically active zones on Earth.

We recorded it!

The seismic waves from this powerful event were captured right across the Australian Seismometers in Schools (AuSIS) network — from classrooms in Perth to regional Victoria.

Fun facts:

- Seismic waves travelled over 10,000 km, reaching Australia in just 13–15 minutes faster than a passenger jet.
- The energy released was equivalent to 1 billion tonnes of TNT over 50,000 times that of the Hiroshima atomic bomb.
- More than 35 aftershocks over magnitude 5.0 have already been recorded with M7+ events still possible.

This is what makes Earth science exciting — real data, real events, and real-world learning in action. Through AuSIS, we're helping young Australians experience the dynamic Earth in real time, turning classrooms into seismic observatories.




