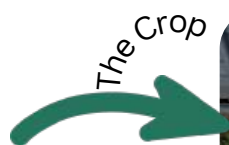

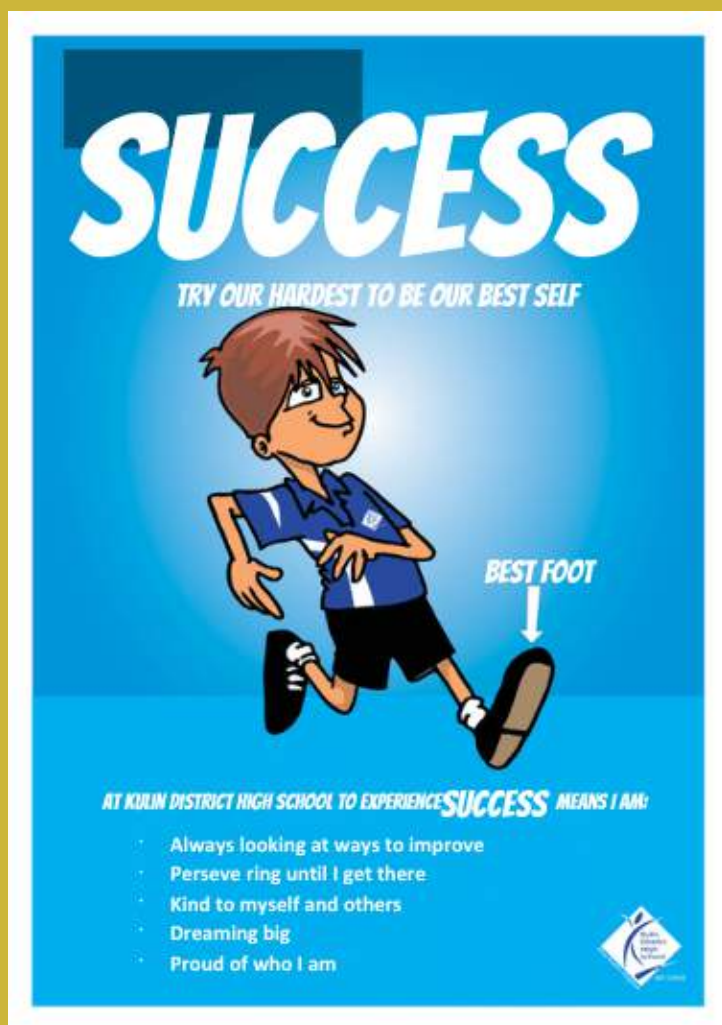

Thank you to everyone who assisted us in making this fantastic day happen at our school. We very much hope it will be the first of many.

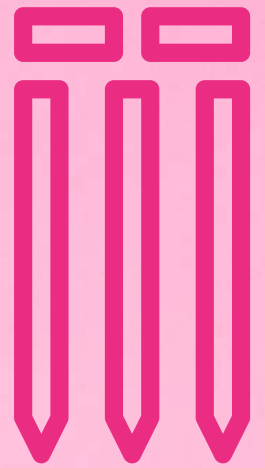

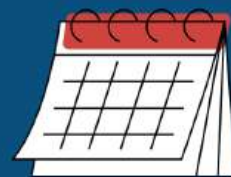

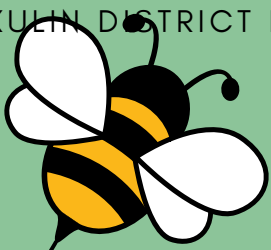

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all the parents and staff who dedicated their Sunday to make this event a success.



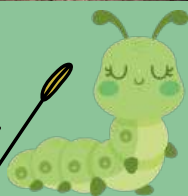

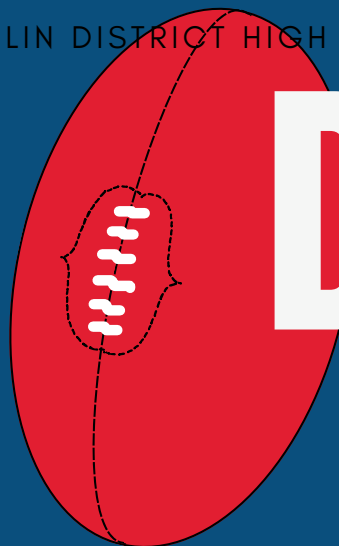
